PAWTUCKET, RI (February 27, 2019) - The Burbage Theatre Co announces the fifth production of their Eighth Season (2018-2019) with *OUR TOWN by Thornton Wilder* directed by Mark Peckham, running from March 15 to April 7 at TEN31 Productions (249 Roosevelt Avenue, Pawtucket, RI).

"New Hampshire 1901 was not all that different from Pawtucket, Rhode Island right now. Surely there are differences between Thornton Wilder's snapshot of idyllic Grover's Corners in 1901 and along our own Blackstone River, here in 2019. But that's true only in a superficial way, really," says Artistic Director Jeff Church, "This play, at its heart, is about us. All of us. Swept up by time. Subject to inescapable change. Struggling to cherish what we have as the present recedes inevitably into the past.

"Wilder reminds us that while our conditions may change and the trappings of life may become more complex, we have always been linked by the fact that this bewildering experience of living comes with a expiration date. We are victims of ephemera, all of us. Then and now. We share this. Our Town guides us to acknowledge that we are unable to see life's worth while living. But that, from time to time, by taking a step away and out of time, we can catch a glimpse of its beauty."

OUR TOWN runs from March 15 to April 7 at TEN31 Productions.

Tickets are \$25 (General admission), \$15 (Students); preview performances are \$15. High school students receive free admission to any performance that isn't SOLD OUT.
